Economic Benefits

Solar farms can contribute to economic growth:

- Up to ~\$400 million in private capital investments
- If built at its full size the project would pay ~\$115 million in property tax revenues in the first 25-year of operations. This includes approximately:
 - \$57 million to USD 290 School District
 - \$3.1 million to the Harrison-Lincoln-Ottawa fire District
 - \$1.1 million to the Ottawa Library
