Chamber Board Opposes Measure 5 Constitutional Amendment

The Conservation Measure would direct 4.8 billion into "conservation projects."

The Chamber Board heard presentations from both sides of the issue before voting to support the opponents of Measure 5, joining close to 100 other organizations opposing Measure 5. We encourage you to oppose it because:

- It would be a change to the constitution so it would be very hard to make minor adjustments to the amendment once it is passed. Many legislative bills are tweaked at the next legislative session to fix unintended consequences. Once it is in the constitution, change is almost impossible.
- Supporting the Governor's \$80 million conservation proposal is much more flexible and makes more sense. It's for only 2 years and can be updated to fit the needs every legislative session versus being locked into the constitution.
- Measure 5 will take away valuable resources we need for infrastructure and programs in our state. In Grand Forks we would all benefit from: 42nd street underpass at Demers Avenue, road repairs on Columbia Road

and elsewhere, a backlog of renovation and maintenance in the millions at UND, a new interchange on I-29 in South Grand Forks, support for college student tuition funding, and countless others.

• 4.8 billion is so much money that the proponents have no idea how it would be spent in a constructive manner with any assurance of maximum effi-

ciency and return on investment of the money.

• Out of state interests are pouring millions into the campaign.

Businesses are encouraged to vote no on Measure 5.

Work Begins on Key Legislative Priorities

Team Grand Forks, a coalition of The Chamber, The GF Regional EDC, City of Grand Forks, Grand Forks County and UND have been meeting for months to determine the top legislative priorities for the community. While the final list is not set, several projects are moving to the top of the list.

- 1. 42nd Street Underpass
- 2. 50% state participation in the \$130 million dollar water treatment plant
- 3. Base Retention Funding and other BRIC priorities
- 4. UND maintenance funding
- 5. Airport aprons for UND at GFK

Once formalized, Team Grand Forks will meet with local legislators to gain their support and educate them on the needs so they can help make the upcoming session a success for Grand Forks. The Legislature will also be asked to approve the second half of the funding for the state

medical school. This is expected to be routine, but is still over \$60 million dollars.

Wilfahrt Appointed to NCTC President Search Committee

Chamber President, Barry Wilfahrt will serve as the local community representative on the committee talked with interviewing and recommending candidates for the NCTC President's position.

Dr. Ann Temte will be retiring June 30, 2015 after serving as the President for the past 9 years. The business community enjoys a very close relationship with NCTC since a majority of its graduates work in area businesses.

Wilfahrt said "Dr. Temte has been a vital partner in our community and will be missed. The selection

of the right person as leader of NCTC is vital to helping meet the growing workforce demands of local employers."

A new NCTC President will likely be named next Spring.

Chamber and EDC Meet With Lt. Governor Wrigley

Representatives from The Chamber and GF Regional EDC met with Lt Governor Drew Wrigley to hear about the state's "Find the Good Life" campaign and visit about the local workforce development committee's work.

Grand Forks has 6 subcommittees of HR Directors and support agency professionals working specific ways to connect potential employees to the local workforce. Specific strategies are being developed for veterans, college students, new Americans, retired senior citizens who may want very part-time work, high school students, people with special needs and "non-placeables" (people who have had more than 8 jobs in the past 2 years). Each group presents specific challenges and barriers to employment and the committee is looking at every way possible to get some of these hard to place groups into the workforce.

JLG Architects Receives National Recognition

The North Dakota Chapter of the American Institute of Architects has awarded three of the five total annual design awards to projects by JLG Architects:

Merit Award, Loretta Building; Fargo, ND

An historic building in the heart of downtown Fargo which began as a furniture store and saw its share of ups and downs throughout the years has hit its peak 100 years after its original construction. Now a center of commerce in Fargo's vibrant downtown scene, Loretta improves the overall density and walkability of the area and also showcases an important piece of Fargo's built history. The building serves the downtown community by providing prime retail and office space for eighteen businesses, including a restaurant, a clothing retailer, and an art gallery. Through creative use of both new materials and existing resources, the designers were able to combine the character of yesterday with amenities and furnishings which fit today's tastes. The result is a building which can be described as quintessentially "Fargo:" quirky, funky, and gracious.

Merit Award, Williston Area Recreation Center; Williston, ND

As the largest park districtowned indoor recreation center in the country, the Williston Area Recreation Center (WARC) makes a big impact



on a booming community. Located on the Williston State College Campus and partnering

with the Williston Park District to attract and retain families, the WARC was designed and built as an investment in the long-term quality of life for the entire population. Including unique features such as an indoor turf field, golf simulator, high-tech pitching simulator, and kitchen space for cooking classes – all of which were provided under budget and on schedule – the WARC successfully engages the entire Williston community. JLG collaborated on this project with Sink Combs Dethlefs.

Juror's Choice Award, NDSU Beef Research Facility: Fargo, ND

ity; Fargo, ND NDSU has always been a leader in agricultural research and education. The new NDSU Beef Research Facility is one of three facilities in North America equipped with the capability to control feed mixes and monitor dietary and developmental results. This building includes an open-air front porch to greet faculty. Translucent panels are used extensively on the roof and walls to minimize the amount of artificial lighting required during the day. The site landscaping, the water-settling area and other exterior details enhance the performance of the facility and complement the design. All these details come together to create a unique place to study, teach and visit.


Jeff Rerick, a teacher at Grafton Public School in Grafton, applied and won a grant for the 2013-14 school year to purchase K'NEX Building Systems.
