**Diabetes Education**. Washington County FACS Agent markets diabetes education classes to local physicians, Community Health Centers, Washington County Senior Citizen Center, and Civic Organizations.

• The Ins and Outs of Diabetes is a 3 hour comprehensive program designed to inform clients to make better food choices.

- One on One Consults are given onsite at Extension office to those who cannot wait for a class to come up and need immediate information and help.

#### Food Safety Education and Home

**Food Preservation**. The FACS Agent taught Food Safety programs for the Washington County School System and the online Community which turned International. The goal was to minimize the risk of foodborne illness. Due to Covid-19 many gardens were planted and an increase in food preservation

- *ServSafe* is a National Food Safety Program that is taught through Extension with collaborations with Jet, OFTC, BOE & Community Restaurants.
- Summer and Fall Home Food Preservation Program was taught in collaboration with Burke County Extension through Virtual Classes with International participants.
- Virtual Income Tax Assistance Program. Agent provided Free Income Tax Assistance Preparations with the help of

UGA students.

**GACAA** – Rocky Tanner was named County Agent of the year at the 2019 GACAA meeting by GA Cattleman's Association.

**Hosted area production meetings** for producers to provide updates for corn, cotton, soybeans, peanuts, insect, weed, pecan, and disease control. There were 5 meetings that had approximately 450 attendees. These meetings also allow producers to earn much needed pesticide credits for private and commercial pesticide license holders.

**Beef Programming** – I work closely with area cattleman to assist with all areas of beef production. Soil, feed, and forage testing. Presented forage and hay information at local cattlemen's meeting. The agent is also a



member of the Georgia HERD team. This effort is a collaboration between UGA, Georgia Cattlemen's Association and producers across the state. The program consigns, evaluates and develops beef heifers so they can go back to the herd. This is a demonstrated educational program that producers can use on their own farm.

**Peanut maturity checks**- I performed 45 peanut maturity checks at Producer's Ag in Davisboro, GA. Peanut maturity checks help producers make timely harvest decisions. The timing on peanut harvest can optimally come down to a 2 to 3-day window.

**Harvest Yield Contests** - Submitted corn yield contest entries for 2 growers in Washington County. Submitted Southeast Forage contest entries for a Washington producer. Hitchcock Farms received 2019 peanut achievement award for their specific farm size category.

**Specialists in the County-** I have coordinated multiple site visits in Washington County by Clint Waltz (turf grass specialist), Dr. Corey Bryant (grain specialist), Dr. Bob Kemerait (crop disease specialist), and Andrew Sawyer (area pecan specialist). I have also directly worked with Dr. Gary Burtle (pond specialist), Dr. Lisa Baxter (forage specialist), Dr. David Dickens (forestry specialist), and Dr. Elizabeth Little (forest entomologist) on several issues in Washington County. A strong relationship with specialists allows local agents to connect Washington County citizens with quality information

**Media Submissions** – The agent has written multiple articles for local newspapers.

**On Site Consultations/Farm visits/phone calls** – The agent has made site visits when necessary to address problems or issues with all agronomic crops, turf grasses, ornamental issues, water quality issues, pond weed management, hay field production decisions, disease issues in peanuts, corn, and soybeans. Approximately 60 site visits were done in Washington County with over 100 face to face contacts, approximately 400 phone calls, texts, and emails.

**Samples-** Washington County had 472 water, soil, feed, and tissue analysis submissions for 2020.
